Discussion:

RCPP signup is going well. We have received a lot of applicants. Making the deadline will be tight. We have a soft deadline for application submission by March 22- hard deadline March 27

Farmers are applying for all practices, a lot of them are nutrient management plans, reduced till, cover crops and perennial grasses. 100 acres in perennial grasses.

Jennifer had a call with NRCS- farmers can qualify for RCPP on ground with CRP if they don't double up on practice.

Application rollover occurs if they are approved this year. They could be approved the next year.

Question about farmers in Champaign County- Will not be placed high due to location. Jeff had submitted questions about ranking- NRCS will be approving applications.

If people have been in a program for 5 years, they will need new resource concerns to qualify for RCPP.

Workflow after March 27th – Ranking begins once all applications are in. The procuss is done by May 31st, then applications are awarded around middle June. When the contract is signed the planning can begin.

Board memebrs do not need to worry about going over budget for charged hours. The yearly budget is estimated and is flexible. Jeff doesn't think this will be an issue.

Board members should not back off on signing up high priority fields, regardless of the time frame.

Growers have some nutrient management concerns. They are interested in nutrient management incentive if doing other practices to offset the nitrogen penalty and possible insecticide costs associated with cover crops.

We are not accepting applications on hemp this year. Maybe 2025.

When talking about farmer hesitation, a concern that these programs may not cover the total cost and makes people hesitant. Low corn prices may get people to seek out additional income through these practices.
